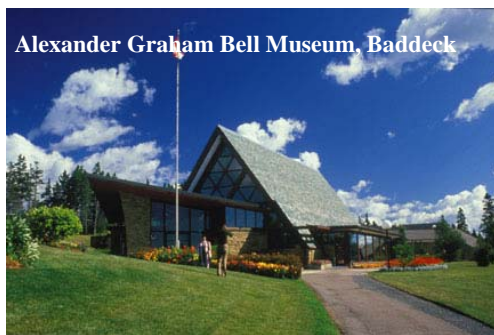




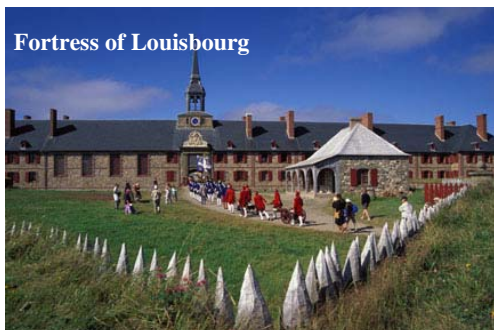
CAPE BRETON

What you'll find:

▲ Baddeck, situated on the beautiful Bras d'Or Lakes, is one of the country's most popular resort communities. Don't miss the Alexander Graham Bell national Historic Site, one of Nova Scotia's finest museums.

▲ Cape Breton Highlands National Park is recognized for its amazing highlands and spectacular ocean scenery. The Park covers 950 square kilometres and is the largest protected wilderness area in the Province. Keltic Lodge, one of Nova Scotia's finest resorts, and the award winning Highland Links Golf Course are both found in the Park. Hiking, fishing, cycling and camping are just a few of the activities you can persue.

▲ Cheticamp is an Acadian village that has a personality all its own and is filled with rich history and colourful language. Cheticamp is a good place to take a whale watching tour.

▲ The Margarees, named after the Margaree River, are renowned for salmon fishing and very popular with nature lovers and outdoor adventurers.

▲ A trip to the Fortress of Louisbourg, found on the Marconi Trail, is one of Nova Scotia's most historic and rewarding experiences. Animators re-enacting life and work from the 18th century provide an authentic replica of 1744. Plan on spending the whole day here soaking in the history and reliving the adventure.
