Drive the Lighthouse Route along the picturesque South Shore offering an unforgettable landscape of coastal beauty and historic charm. You'll find pristine white sand beaches, stately lighthouses, island – studded bays, weathered fishing villages, wooden sailing boats and even a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

*What you'll find:*

▲ Chester, a town founded in 1759 by the New England Planters. This historic seaside village is noted for sailing, golfing, majestic homes, studio galleries and a relaxed life-style.

▲ Mahone Bay, where the three waterfront churches form one of the most photographed scenes in Nova Scotia. A unique collection of studios & galleries, home to some of Canada's finest artist and craftspeople, line the streets. Visit in August for the Wooden Boat Festival or in October for the Scarecrow Festival

▲ Lunenburg, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. One of only two urban districts in North America to have such a distinction. Lunenburg boasts an extraordinary level of preservation including streets that still follow a British colonial model town plan, dozens of historic buildings and homes featuring magnificent 18th and 19th century wooden architecture and long association with the fishing industry. Colourful and decorative architecture, the imposing Lunenburg Academy, the Fisheries Museum of the Atlantic and Lunenburg's famous working waterfront are not to be missed.
